SIR GEORGE GODBER HAEMOPHILIA Clearly it is excellent news that there should be this prospect of more effective control of haemophilia. Equally clearly it would be wrong and indeed impossible to seek to limit the use of the special products in the circumstances set out in your minute. But that being said I suggest that we ought to consider how far the home supply can be increased and what the possibilities are for such an increase leading to a lower cost. Furthermore, it would be helpful for us to have any estimate at all that is possible of the likely increase of cost, since I confess to be somewhat alarmed by your estimate "in millions of pounds".
