Many thanks for your letter. With regard to the status of AIDS in the U.K. I agree with you that there hasn't been any major change. The recommendations of the World Federation of Haemophilia Medical Board has set out on page 3 of their document seem to me to be clearly benign and not very consciebtious. If anything it errs in recommending too little but I don't think that we need emphasise this to the Society members and I am not convinced that much is to be gained by circulating them again at the present time. For your information I am enclosing a copy of a letter which Dr. Rizza and I have circulated to Haemophilia Centre Directors. This is for the information of Society Officers when formulating their own advice to members and I do not think it would be appropriate to circulate this letter to the membership at large. If you have any specific point that I may have missed please don't hesitate to let me know.
