Dear Dr. Maycock,

Provision of Plasma for Fractionation

At the present moment my Plasma Processing Department recovers plasma from 41% of donations taken in this region and I am presently engaged in an attempt at making the best of our existing facilities. I would like to increase the proportion of plasma sent to you as 18-hour FFP, thereby increasing the number of units of concentrated cells supplied to hospitals and reducing the amount of plasma siphoned off after the time expiry date. However, this would mean the purchase of an increased proportion of double packs and I am sure that my RHA will require some financial justification for this before agreeing.

In common with most regions, a fair amount of money is still spent in Trent on commercial Factor VIII. Is it possible that you would be in a position to let us have more Factor VIII concentrate if we were to send you more than the present allocation of FFP. This will obviously mean something to the Treasurer's department and on this basis I am sure they would agree to give me the extra revenue. I appreciate that you may well be approaching capacity so far as Factor VIII production is concerned but, since I do not know the exact position, I thought that this approach to you might be worthwhile.

Incidentally, if we were to come to this kind of arrangement, it would inevitably reduce the amount of time-expired plasma which we would be providing. Since at the moment we are one of your few suppliers of plasma in Winchesters, I would be grateful if you would give me a minimum figure for this type of plasma which you require from us.
