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SHORTAGES OF BLOOD

You are aware of the leading article by Dr Cash in the BMJ of 12 September and my response the following week. Since then I have had a telephone call from a haemotologist at St Lukes Hospital, Guildford, stating they have had to cancel surgical lists because the S W Thames Blood Transfusion Service for the two South Thames RHAs under Dr Keith Rogers has not been able to supply blood. In this week's MBJ a surgical registrar at Frimley Park Hospital confirms the difficulty of getting blood and alleges that a patient bled to death because blood for her had to be used on a younger patient. The Guardian and Times have picked this up in today's issues.

2. It is true that the supply of blood by the S W Thames Regional Transfusion Centre has given cause for concern for some time now and that the RHA's have not been able to solve the problem. I believe that the Department needs to force the Regions to take urgent remedial action now.
