Brian and I both enjoyed meeting you again on 28th November, and we appreciated the time you were able to devote to discussion of Travenol plans to extend our industrial investment here in Britain.

You will find attached my "official" letter suggesting that discussions could usefully commence, on the issue of providing sufficient blood products to meet U.K. needs without recourse to costly imports. Brian and I believe it might be possible for a company such as Travenol to work with the various groups within the National Health Service here, with an overall objective of making the country self sufficient for all needed blood products, through a voluntary donor service. Neither of us believes that such a collaborative approach would be easy to work out, we both have reservations – as expressed to you. For the benefit of all concerned, I feel that preliminary and very thorough discussion should take place – with all minds as open as possible to new ideas and different ways of doing things.
