## AIDS LEAFLET

- 1. Thank you for copying to me your minute and enclosure of 9 May. I apologise for this belated response, due partly to my having been on leave for some of the intervening period. This is a joint response from Mr Cunningham and myself.
- 2. Mr Cunningham has suggested the following revised wording to the first two sentences of the third section of the draft (under the heading "Who is at risk from AIDS?"):

"If AIDS is caused by a virus, there is no evidence that the virus is transmitted by ordinary, day-to-day contact. There is, however, some indication that certain groups....."

Also, the small amendments to the next section:

"Yes. Although....be reported. A very close watch....."
These amendments seem sensible.

- 3. My only comment on the draft text is to support your suggested alternative of "practising homosexuals" for "homosexual or bi-sexual men". To me the former is more neutral than the latter (although I am not quite sure why!) and, as you know, Ministers are very concerned about the sensitivities attached to links between AIDS and homosexual activity
- 4. You will know that we intend to propose a health education initiative on AIDS. I hope to put a submission forward this week, through Dr Harris, and I will copy it to you and others with the 'blood' interest. The submission will contain a cross-reference to the revision of the blood donation leaflet.
