When I met you in clinic last week you indicated that you might be willing to help lobby for equitable access to antiviral drugs. Charles Gore of the Hepatitis C Trust, Graham Foster a hepatologist from The Royal London Hospital, and I have been lobbying for an early access scheme for Sofosbuvir since December but we appear to be making little headway with NHS England. Mr Qualie, a pharmacist with NHS England suggests in his email below that they are following a process but in reality they are inventing the process and creating new hurdles as they go along.

There is a meeting hosted by the Hep C Trust tomorrow to explain some of the issues to journalists in London. I appreciate that at this short notice you may not be able to make it to London for this meeting. However, if you were willing I would like to be able to put journalists in contact with you. In addition there is likely to be a second press conference immediately after the European Liver Meeting in London this week.

I fully understand that there is a process involved and that the process is new. Nonetheless my understanding is that it has simply come down to a question of cost. Since this is about saving lives which presumably is a top NHS priority it certainly looks from our vantage point that once again hepatitis C patients, coming as they do largely from the bottom socioeconomic quintiles, are being de-prioritised.
