I write in response to your letter dated 21<sup>st</sup> March 2000. This arrived during my absence on leave.

Whilst I was away you received numbers 34 to 48 in our supplementary list. I am pleased to say, the Department has now found more documents (namely some of those which I listed in Annex A to my letter dated 9<sup>th</sup> March 2000 as being missing.) I have listed them as number 49 onwards in the supplementary list.

I note your anxiety about the disclosure statement. Thus far, you have had everything we have uncovered.
