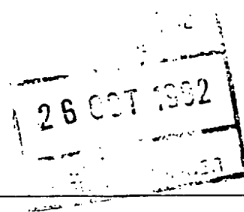

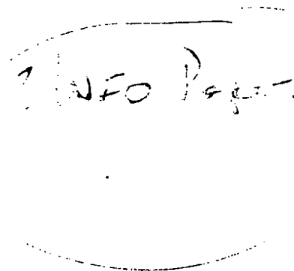

Dear Ken,

I am sorry I am not able to be at the meeting of the Network but I have a meeting on the preparation of my Strategic Plan with the members of my Management Executive which I must have today to fit in with the schedule for the Board. I hope the cover for the Plan will provide a suitable picture of the Oxford Region.

I enclose two papers and apologise for the lateness.

The paper on screening was prepared following a meeting with Dr. MacInnes on Tuesday and summarises the way in which the Network can work. Funds are needed to support the work of the Network and one way to do this is for Regions to support the Network, as I have indicated in the section on antenatal screening. Dr. MacInnes has also said that project grants could be available from the Department.

The second paper, which is impossible for you to read at speed although you may wish to read the conclusions, summarises the views of public health doctors in Oxford on Factor 8m, about which Graham wrote to you. It shows the type of work that is happening and which the Network could realise.
