I am now able to supply you with the information requested under Section 44 of the Medicines Act in your letter of 2 February 1976. Our answers to question numbers 1 to 3 are contained in the appendix attached to this letter. We have not yet had a confirmation from Cutter that they will provide on-going information about the rejection of donors or donations, centre by centre. I cannot foresee that this will be a problem and will let you know further about this matter as soon as possible. In addition they have not yet formerly agreed to the imposition of the batch release procedure if necessary, but they are aware that this procedure exists in the U.K. and they have already agreed in principle to it.
