DR SHAW HAS ASKED ME TO INFORM YOU THAT WE HAVE BEEN ADVISED OF ONE HAEMOPHILIAG CASE OF SUSPECTED AIDS

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REPORTED TO US WHERE FACTORATE BATCH T40405 (3 BOTTLES) HAD BEEN GIVEN IN APRIL 1980. THIS PATIENT HAS ALSO RECEIVED 8 BATCHES OF IMMUNO PRODUCT ALSO UK NHS MANUFACTURED FACTOR VIII.

THE PATIENT IN QUESTION CONTRACTED AN OPPORTUNIST INFECTION (DRO-DESOPHAGEL CANDIDIASIS) AROUND DECEMBER 1982 TO JANUARY 1983 AND HAS REDUCED HELPER AND KILLER LYMPHOCYTES. THERE IS SOME MALAISE AND LOSS OF WEIGHT, BUT HE IS NOT SEVERELY ILL. THE CLINICIAN IS NOT CONVINCED THAT THIS IS A DEFINITE CASE OF AIDS BUT IT MEETS THE CRITERION ESTABLISHED BY THE CENTRAL DISEASE SURVEILLANCE CENTRE, COLLINGDALE, HENGE HAS BEEN REPORTED AS A SUSPECTED CASE.

DR SHAW SUGGESTS THAT IT MIGHT BE PRUDENT TO CHECK ON THE PLASMA POOL SOURCE AND OTHER RECIPIENTS OF THIS SATCH TO SEE IF THERE IS ANY FURTHER CONNECTION WITH A SUSPECTED AIDS CASE.
