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ACQUIRED IMMUNE DEFICIENCY SYNDROME

Cutter Statement of Policy

Acquired Immun. Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) is a serious disease which impairs a person's natural immune system. Very little is known about the cause of the disease and there is no test that identifies a person carrying AIDS. According to U.S. Government health authorities, three specific population groups appear to be more at risk than the rest of the population. These groups are male homosexuals, intravenous drug users and recent visitors or inhabitants of Haiti:

Another small group is emerging as having a risk of contracting AIDS: persons receiving blood or blood products.

Cutter is instituting a program for the selection of plasma donors in order to reduce the possibility of AIDS being transmitted through blood-derived products.

This program requires potential plasma donors to read a statement concerning the serious nature of AIDS. A donor who acknowledges being a male homosexual, a user of intravenous drugs or a recent resident or visitor to Haiti will not be accepted as a plasma donor.

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This donor acceptance policy will be changed appropriately as further information about the disease becomes available. Cutter has intensively involved its people and resources to contribute to a resolution of this segment of the AIDS problem.
