RE: AIDS MEETING 2/18/83

1. No report was available from the CDC on current status. For the future, Regulatory will contact the CDC weekly even if only the AIDS information desk. Panny will subscribe to MMWR.

A current report on AIDS was picked up by Charlene Wisdom at a meeting at the Los Angeles Public Health Department. This meeting was attended by Dr. Auerback from the L.A. CDC office. The meeting is to be held monthly - March 15 next - and consists of interested persons in AIDS research. Dr. McAuley and Charlene Wisdom will attend the March meeting.

2. Lyo Cryo Task Force is to meet next week with Bill Hartin on cost and time.
3. Sales reports some major customers slowing AHF orders. Anaheim Memorial has switched to Cryo. Rochester Hemophilia Treatment Center also has moved to Cryo. Orthopedic and Childrens Hospitals in Los Angeles orders are down.
4. R/D Strategy - Charlene Wisdom presented a proposal for a prospective study with Lot AI-3661 material. This will be discussed further at the next Task Force meeting.
5. Heat Treated AHF - Still much confusion on status of this project. Will schedule report at next meeting from Heat Treated Task Force.

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6. Statistical review - No news.
7. Anti Core Testing proceeding to develop on Lot of AHF. Several objections to the project from Dr. McAuley and Penny Carr. Will be discussed further next week.
8. Changes in AHF labeling due to AIDS to be discussed by Penny Carr with the OB.
9. Dallas donor of normal source plasma was identified at NEI Dallas. Alpha received 11 donations from this donor who has possibly some AIDS symptoms but not diagnosed with AIDS. The plasma is in 4 Lots of AHF that were put on hold pending further information. Dr. McAuley talked to the donor's physician in Dallas and learned the donor has symptoms of lymphadenopathy but little else to connect him with AIDS. He is being followed. We will release the AHF product but not use any plasma from the donor not yet pooled. Penny will discuss with the Bureau - What if we do find a donor who comes down with AIDS and we do have plasma in product in the field.
10. It was reputed by Penny that a position on AIDS will be published by the Bureau within the next week. This is not expected to be anything of a significant difference to what is already present.
