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14. ACQUIRED IMMUNE DEFICIENCY SYNDROME (AIDS) -
 EXCLUSION OF PLASMA DERIVED PRIMARILY FROM HOMOS-
 SEXUAL DONORS - J. HINK

J. Hink explained that the industry has been asked to assure that plasma collected from homosexual donors not be used in the production of coagulation products. Basically, this applies to the centers which supply anti-HB plasma, which comes primarily from homosexuals. The request is specific for centers which supply this type of plasma and does not apply to individual donors.

A change in BPR's and QA documents will be necessary to assure that this plasma does not go into final product. Approximately 4,500 liters of anti-HB plasma are fractionated yearly for the production of HBIG, either for Cutter or Abbott. J. Hink indicated that, for the time being, the cryoprecipitate from much of this plasma has been and can be used for developmental work, and, therefore, will not be lost. The time span for continuing this action was discussed. One month was originally recommended; two to three months may be more reasonable, but the possibility that this may become a more or less permanent hold should be considered.

Decisions:

Follow the recommendation of the BOB; schedule for reconsideration in January; review the situation monthly.
