

As a sequel to our recent discussions on Heat Treated Factorate and HTLV-III sero-conversion, I received a telephone call today from Dr. Hunt at the Hammersmith Hospital.

She reports that one of her patients who was minimally treated prior to the beginning of this year (no treatment since 1983) received the following batches of Factorate H.T. on the dates shown:-

Y91309 - 28/2/85

Y90308 - 4/3/85

A10801 - 18/3/85

He was HTLV-III negative in March, but his September sample proved to be positive.

The patient has suffered from intermittent lichen planus for several years and has some palpable lymph nodes.

The patient is somewhat elusive and does not attend appointments regularly and Dr. Hunt needs to get him back to clinic for a full follow-up. For example, she needs to re-test to ensure that it is not a false positive and to check whether he has been treated elsewhere with NHS or other commercial Factor VIII. Her records only show Armour Heat Treated as indicated. She does not think that he falls into any other risk category for AIDS except his hasemophilia treatment.

I have arranged to call and see Dr. Hunt as soon as she has cathered all the available information so that we obtain a full picture. I have promised to advise her if any other similar reports relating to these batches are received in the meantime.

I do not wish to cause unnecessary anxiety, but it would certainly be useful to know if any of the sero-conversions recorded by Dr. Rizza relate to these three batches.
