re. Blood Transfusion and Hepatitis Testing

I enclose a copy of a letter I received today from my local Blood Transfusion Chief Executive.

As the Consultant in Administrative Charge of Blood Bank at this hospital, I am charged with the issue of 'safe' blood to patients. It would seem that although there is a 'test' which could improve the safety of the blood issued in my name it appears that for financial reasons in this country it has been decided not to use it.

In view of the recent controversy in France where delay in introducing a known technology to improve safety of blood products resulted in doctors subsequently going to prison, I would be grateful if you could reassure me as to my position if any patient at the RVI were to develop Hepatitis B despite my knowing that the blood had not been tested as rigorously as is possible.

There are of course implications of this decision for the Trust as a whole with regard to which patients should be vaccinated against Hepatitis B particularly if it is known that they are likely to receive a blood transfusion.
