Further to your letter of 9th June, reference AEP/SW/36577, we have now been able to contact the above donor. The delay was due to her having changed her name on marriage - it is now Mrs. GRO-A - and it was just by coincidence that we found this out. This donor is a nurse and she has answered our questions in the following way :-

She has not at any time had jaundice.

Within the last two years she ^{states she} has not been in contact with infective hepatitis, but has attended four patients with jaundice (two cirrhotic, one obstructive jaundice and one of unknown origin). These were patients at Queen Alexander Military Hospital, Milbank, London, S.W.1., on 'Allen' and 'Queen Alexandra' wards, between January and June 1964.

The donor states that the hospital would supply further information if necessary, but she is sorry she cannot remember the names or accurate dates.
