Right Ankle: Mr  has had no improvement from physiotherapy. Still walking with quite marked inversion. He is locally and specifically tender along the lateral joint line, close to the anterior tibio-fibula syndesmosis. In view to his non-response to conservative treatment, I think he would benefit from a lateral longitudinal arthrotomy with a view to removing the quite marked anterior osteophyte. He lives with his girlfriend in Surrey and has problems with looking after dogs and cats. He is going to talk to Mrs Miller with a view to sorting this out.

Operation was due in February but as Mr Ribbans has now left the Royal Free, Mr  will be re-assessed by Mr Goddard.

Mr  was involved in an RTA in April when he hit another car. On the left, I suspect he may well have had a calf bleed, as he described swelling and bruising into the calf and the knee and, he still has a residual haematoma over the level of the tibial tuberosity. The Left Ankle had a brief exacerbation. Right Ankle is the worse affected - this of course was previously involved but has had increased bleeds and pain.
