I refer to your request where you asked:

Under FOI I would like to know the following:

In a statement released on 28th January 2020, you advised "we are taking forward concerns about differing financial support schemes across the UK and will be discussing these with the devolved administrations as a matter of urgency and are doing all we can to achieve greater parity of support across the UK".

Now, bear in mind, that previous statements released to this effect have shown that it hasn't been "a matter of urgency" due to only having 1 meeting on the 10th July 2019, my question under FOI is:

Define urgency? Have you engaged with the devolved administrations? If not, when do you plan to hold these meetings to "achieve greater parity of support".

Officials are in discussion with their counterparts in the Devolved Administrations to achieve greater parity of support across the UK schemes. Payments have increased in Northern Ireland and discussions are ongoing to resolve as soon as possible the immediate and pressing disparity between the support schemes in England, Northern Ireland and Wales.
