Re: Settlement to Haemophiliacs  
---and/or Dependents, HIV Positive

I am writing to you with regard to the above matter which you brought to the attention of Mr. Major during the latter part of last year after a long and tedious battle on the part of the people involved. This was very much appreciated, as, due to your constant and vigilant endeavours, the litigation was stopped and we thought we had "won". This however, would appear not to be the case, and I enclose a copy of a letter received from my Solicitor to-day explaining that the payments will not be made during April as promised.

It would appear that the Government can play around with the lives and deaths of people at will, and as litigants we have a right to know what the hold up is. People are dying not knowing whether or not their loved ones will eventually get any money and unable to make financial arrangements for them. Surely when a promise is made this should be honoured. If it is a case of one or two people not bothering then so be it, leave them out, but for Heavens sake, be fair to the rest. It is bad enough being a Haemophiliac without the scourge which AIDS has presented.

Please restore our faith in people and help us to get this settled - SOON.
