Dr. Neelam Radja, Consultant in Genito-Urinary Medicine and myself reviewed Gary on the 8th September. He is keeping very well with no major bleeds to mention. He has not had an episode of haematuria since he was last seen in July 2004. He manages his bleeds with ondemand Factor VIII (Kogenate). Dr. Radja noted that Gary was diagnosed with HIV in 1990 if not earlier and he has kept very well since then. His CD4 count is presently more than 500 with a HIV viral load of less than 100 copies. He has not been on any treatment from the HIV point of view except for probable Azathioprine mono-therapy for a short time in 1990. Dr. Radja was wondering whether Gary is a slow progressor. Gary has given consent to take part in a study being conducted in Southampton on slow progressors in HIV.

We have taken blood for Factor VIII, Factor VIII inhibitor levels, full blood count, LFTs, CD4 and viral load. Considering his well-being he will be reviewed again in three months time.
