Thank you very much for your letter of 9 October 1985. I am sorry that you yourself will be unable to attend Craigavon but look forward to seeing Miss Steven there.

As I explained to you on the telephone, I am trying to treat all the haemophilics in the same manner to prevent any panic amongst the very few patients who are positive. I would like to talk to you personally about GRO-A before he goes to London. I do not think it proper to discuss detailed patient management on the telephone. Would it be possible for you to come up to the RVH before the end of October and have a few words with me? If not, would you contact my secretary by telephone and see if I might call into Mitchell House and chat to you there. I could do this on the way home some evening.

I am delighted to learn that GRO-A is going to London and I have written to Dr. Mæachin in the Middlesex Hospital to see if he will carry out any emergency treatment during the visit. I would also need to give you or Miss Steven a letter to take with you and possibly Dr. Mæachin might need some supplies of clotting material to treat GRO-A
