Dear Dr. Woods

As you already know, I saw the above on 7 January 1986 and on full clinical examination there was no evidence of any lymphadenopathy, organomegaly, skin rashes or, indeed, any other stigmata of a possible virus infection. I have given him further reassurance and think this must be continued and that I must see him at monthly or 2-monthly intervals.

He has been positive for some time and thankfully he has developed no further problem relative to HTLVIII infection. He continues to have slightly abnormal liver function tests but these have been present intermittently since 1978. His haemoglobin is very satisfactory at 15 gm. with a normal white cell count and normal lymphocyte count and platelet count.
