William,

I wouldn't normally alert you to such FOI requests, but as this one has come from a press agency called 'John Connors Press Agency'. Rakesh (who leads our media relations) has alerted DH press office. The FOI request was:

- 1.. Could you please provide us of a transcript of the minutes of the meeting of the CJD Incidence Panel [a Department of Health risk assessment committee] in 2000 where it was decided not to tell recipients of infected blood that the donor had died with symptoms of variant CJD, and they may be at risk from the fatal infection.
- 2.. Please provide copies of any other records you may hold relating to the decision NOT to tell recipients that blood they had been given was infected with vCJD.'

We have not finalised our response to this request yet, but it will be along the lines that Dr Hewitt talks about in her email below. As you can see we will almost be certainly referring to a letter from the Deputy CMO. The press agency must be interested following the recent coroners inquest into someone who died of vCJD>

Dear Narinder

This, I am afraid to say, is in my court.

I believe that for the first part of the request, it is appropriate to refer the requestor to the CJD Incident Panel?

For the second part of the request, the decision was not made by the NBS. The advice that there was no need to inform recipients who had been transfused with blood from a donor who later developed vCJD (note: the question asks about "blood they had been given was infected with vCJD", but we have no means of telling whether any blood is infected with vCJD) was given in a letter from the Deputy Chief Medical Officer in 1998: PL (CO) (98) 1. I attach a copy of that letter.

I have numerous documents relating to the decision, in the context that the NBS liased with the Clinical Incident Panel, after the Incident Panel was formed, and there were many discussions at the Panel and within the NBS. Furthermore, when the Incident Panel advised that recipients should be informed, and DH accepted that advice, NBS was involved in the notification procedure. That could all be taken as "relating to the decision", but I believe that the requester is asking for information about the decision NOT to inform, and the NBS had no part in that decision, so I am interpreting this as meaning that none of my later papers are relevant to the specific request. I am sure that BPL will have a similar issue.

As the request relates to advice given by DH, and is from a Press Agency, I believe that it would be appropriate to alert both DH and Corporate Comms to this request. I have therefore copied my reply to Rakesh and to DH.
