SubjectUpdate from DH

Dear John,

I do hope you had an enjoyable break, and are ready for the fray! There is much to update you on.

1. SaBTO - outstanding actions

Draft letters are ready for you to consider re access to human vCJD samples for screening test assessment, and re speeding up generation of safety data from prion filter clinical trials. I can't send these via blackberry, but Mike is back on Monday, so will be able to send them to you then.

Mike will also be able to progress minutes and pub summary next week.

2. Haemophilia patients notification exercise

You will probably have seen the key points of this already in emails that were sent to SaBTO members last week.

The autopsy finding of abnormal prion protein in a haemophiliac was leaked last Sunday in the Telegraph. Our press office did all it could to dissuade the paper from publishing ahead of patients being informed. However, we were unsuccessful. Consequently, every effort was made by the HPA and the UK Haemophilia Centre Doctors' Organisation to inform haemophilia clinicians on Monday; our minister wrote personally to the Haemophilia Society the same day, and HPA issued their press notice on Tuesday. There has subsequently been less coverage by the media than we might have expected. Patients are being contacted by their doctors, although I expect this will take some time to complete. I am meeting with the CE of the Haemophilia Society next week, so will get more feedback then.

3. Publication of the report of the Archer Inquiry

The report of Lord Archer's independent inquiry into contaminated blood/blood products is being published on Monday 23 Feb at 10.30.

We have already alerted SaBTO members to the possibility that they may be approached by the media, and have recommended that all media enquiries are referred to the Department of Health. We have asked to be notified of any media requests that members receive. We are considering, together with NHSBT, whether to ask Richard Tedder to be prepared to speak to the press to explain how the science of testing has developed over the past 20 years, and that blood/blood products are a great deal safer today. If this goes ahead, Richard would be asked to speak in his expert capacity, and not as a member of SaBTO. We do not intend to get drawn into premature speculation on how we might respond to any recommendations the report makes. I will let you know more as this develops.

4. The Penrose Inquiry

We have provided SaBTO members with a link to the Penrose Inquiry website, as there may be some members who are less aware of the specifics of that inquiry.

5. Publication on DH website of a report that considers the implications of vCJD screening.

I'm glad we've managed to get this report into the public domain, as it should help stimulate debate on some of the issues around testing. We have sent the link to SaBTO members so they are aware.
