Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Request - 200211018

Thank you for your request, dated 11 February 2020 in which you asked for the following information from the Ministry of Justice (MoJ):

"Since the incarnation of Rosemary Pauline West on 22/11/95 what has the cost been to the UK taxpayers?"

Your request has been handled under the FOIA.

I have interpreted your request to be that you seek information regarding the incarceration costs of Rosemary Pauline West.

The MoJ does not hold any information within the scope of your request. This is because there is no legal or business requirement for MoJ to do so.

Her Majesty's Prison and Probation Service (HMPPS), the Executive Agency within the department with responsibility for the management and reporting of prison related expenditure, does not collate or analyse costs down to individual prisoner level. The costs recorded on the HMPPS central accounting system do not allow identification of costs attributable to holding individual offenders. As such we do not hold the information as requested.

The FOIA does not oblige a public authority to create information to answer a request if the requested information is not held. The duty is to only provide the recorded information held.

However, outside of the FOIA and on a discretionary basis, you may like to note that HMPPS (prior to 1 April 2017, known as the National Offender Management Service) calculates and publishes annual average costs per prisoner and per prison place at a summary level for each prison in England and Wales by financial year (1 April to 31 March). The calculations are summarised by category of establishment. The most recent published figures for financial year 2018-19 can be accessed on the www.gov.uk website at the following link:
