## Hi Patrick

As discussed, please can you clear the below statement for over the weekend - clear that we have not yet seen the report.

## DH spokesperson:

"We have great sympathy for the patients and families affected by contaminated blood products in the 1970s and 1980s, and will study the findings of Lord Archer's report in detail when we receive it.

"Every reasonable step to minimise risks from blood transfusion has been taken, and robust screening measures are in place to protect patients."

"This Government has gone further than any other administration in making information available, which has included meeting with Lord Archer and cooperating with the inquiry where possible.

On the documents, if asked:

Only 35 of the 4,500 documents released to the Archer enquiry so far have been withheld in full or in part – less than one per cent. The majority of these were withheld because they contain personal information, legal advice or on health and safety grounds.
