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HIV HAEMOPHILIA LITIGATION - SECOND PRELIMINARY EXPERT WITNESS REPORT - DR R WILLIAMS - HEPATITIS

- I enclose a copy of the second preliminary report from Dr Williams.
- 2. He has considered most of the points that were discussed with Counsel at our meeting with him, and I enclose a brief summary of that meeting for your information.
- 3. As regards the report I believe there are a couple of inaccuracies. At the bottom of page 1 top of page 2 I believe Dr Williams has incorrectly interpreted the enclosed paper by Drs Lee and Kernoff, bottom of page 416 top page 417. I believe that paper suggests that conventional dry heating was largely effective against HIV but not so against hepatitis.
- 4. I believe that at the bottom of page 3 the penultimate line should state for Factor VIII rather than for Factor IX.
- 5. As regards the paper by Drs Lee and Kernoff, on page 417 the suggestion that monoclonal immuno absorption carries a very high margin of safety has now been shown to be incorrect and monoclonal products now have to include a heating component otherwise they may well transmit NANB hepatitis. You may also wish to be aware that recently a commercial Factor IX concentrate has transmitted HIV. I am not aware of the exact details of the viral inactivation process used.

- 6. I am sure that you will welcome comments from copy recipients on this second report.
- 7. When Counsel has had an opportunity to read this report, perhaps I could be informed as to what the next stage is to be. Are we to have a second meeting with Dr Williams, or do we then ask him to merge aspects of his two reports in an acceptable format for a final report.
