For convenience I am enclosing the Lords' Hansard report of the debate, having sidelined (see cols. 1263-4) that part of his speech which deals with Ms Maher's request which is, of course, a deeply serious one, involving as it does her closely documented implication that the House of Commons was misled.

Alf Morris assumes that – with your Ministerial responsibility – you will have read the Lords' Hansard report of the debate here on 11 December in which Lord (Peter) Archer, a former Senior Law Officer of the Crown, Lord Rooker and other very senior privy councillors spoke.
