Title of Training Agreement:	Blood Transfusion Trainers' Agreement for NHS Lothian - University Hospitals Division (LUHD) and Lothian Primary Care NHS Division, March 2005

Background:	To ensure that blood transfusion is an integral part of NHS care, it has been recommended that training in blood transfusion should be implemented for all staff involved in the transfusion process. All training should be documented and it has been recommended that competency should be formally assessed and recorded: NHSS Management Executive letter (MEL) 1999, British Committee for Standards in Haematology (BCSH) 1999, Health Department letter (HDL) 2003, and the Serious Hazards of Transfusion report (SHOT) 2003.				
	The transfusion of blood and blood products takes place in almost all ward / clinical areas in LUHD and some clinical areas of the Primary Care Division.				
	At present the Effective Use of Blood (EUB) Continuing Education Programme level 1 safe transfusion package (CEP level 1) is delivered at Divisional induction sessions. Although a short discussion around the key points in the level 1 package is delivered during a risk management workshop at mandatory annual updates following induction, staff should ideally be exposed to the level 1 training package on a yearly basis (to comply with the recommendations in the above documents).				
Objectives:	To provide a sustainable transfusion education framework upon which a transfusion education programme can be delivered within wards / clinical areas of LUHD and Lothian Primary Care NHS Division to all nurses, CSWs, ODAs, ODPs and phlebotomists using the EUB CEP level 1 material.				
Planned Start Date:	1 <sup>st</sup> April 2005 (first wave of Trainers commenced in role July 2004)				
Required Finish Date:	Ongoing				
In Scope:	Materials – EUB CEP level 1.  All registered nurses, enrolled nurses, ODAs, ODPs, trained CSWs, phlebotomists within LUHD and Lothian Primary Care NHS Division.				
Out of scope	Any other education materials  Porters, medical staff, untrained CSWs within LUHD and Lothian Primary Care NHS Division.				



### Method:

#### **Phase 1: Training of Transfusion Trainers**

- 44 trainers nominated within LUHD and Lothian Primary Care NHS Division to date (9 of these were existing trainers). Further Trainers Workshop planned 31/03/05.
- 1 full day commitment from transfusion trainer to attend trainers' workshop
- EUB and Transfusion Practitioners (TPs):

deliver EUB CEP level 1 and level 2, explain roles & responsibilities of trainers and provide an introduction to the national haemovigilance scheme, SHOT:

give overview of blood bank practice;

provide introduction to available learning materials - e-learning site , self-directed learning pack, CD Rom;

introduce support network and suggest methods to aid delivery of education;

agree with trainers that trainers' educational update sessions to be on a monthly basis (maximum 2 hour session per month)

 TP's training plan to be updated on a monthly basis to reflect progress in training of trainers, and delivery of training material by trainers to staff in scope (see below).

### **Phase 2: Delivery of Training by Transfusion Trainers**

- Within their specific locality, the transfusion trainer cascades the EUB CEP level to all members of staff within scope, using:
  - o Face to face method (I hour commitment)
  - o Self-directed learning pack
  - CD Rom / website facility (approx I hour but can be at separate shorter intervals)
- List of attendees at face-to-face sessions recorded at each session and returned to BBTP via TP for collation in national database; copy to be held locally by TP. In addition trainers to update their area's record of staff trained.
- If self-directed learning package used, time to completion to be agreed between staff member and trainer, and verification of successful completion of learning package to be recorded by trainer, when achieved; and area's record of staff trained updated.
- If website used, competency in theoretical knowledge and understanding of transfusion process assessed, and certificate issued when competency achieved (minimum of 80% correct response rate required).
- Data on individuals using the e-learning site to be collated by BBTP and made available to the Division as required, to update local records of staff trained
- All members of staff within scope to agree with trainers to undertake an update session on an annual basis.
- Evaluation forms circulated at each face-to-face session to gather feedback on training materials and delivery. Electronic evaluation form available on elearning site.

	<ul> <li>Establishment of 44 transfusion trainers (number will increase following Trainers Workshop 31/03/05) within LUHD and Lothian Primary Care NHS Division who will have specialist knowledge in transfusion practice and can be contacted for local support and advice.</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>Good practice will be recognised by achievement of competency in theoretical knowledge (where applicable).</li> </ul>				
	Evidence of staff attendance at training.				
	Feedback on training materials and delivery of training material.				
	<ul> <li>Numbers of staff trained reported on monthly basis to BBTP via TP.</li> </ul>				
	Trainers supported during training by TPs.

Areas considered as priority for needir trainer in situ have been those areas with large volumes of staff and / who transfuse blood most frequently.</li> <li>(List of areas with / without identified trainers attached, Appendix 1)</li> </ul>
