Health and Community Care Committee
Hepatitis C

I refer to earlier correspondence by the Health and Community Care Committee arising from Petition PE 185 by Mr Thomas McKissock and your response dated 13 June 2000. The Committee considered your letter at its meeting on 21 June 2000. I enclose a copy of the Official Report of the meeting on 21 June giving the Committee's deliberations on this matter.

The Committee agreed to seek clarification of the your statement contained within paragraph 3, "...that you (the Minister) see limited value in examining an issue on which we (the Executive) already know the outcome, and for this reason she (the Minister) does not intend to extend further the remit of this exercise." The Committee is unsure why you have excluded all persons who have contracted hepatitis C due to contaminated blood products from the inquiry and why the remit is limited to examine the heat treatment of Factor VIII in the period 1985-87. The Committee is concerned that there may be implications for those who contracted hepatitis C through contaminated blood products and who are not haemophiliacs should the question of compensation be addressed.

In addition the Committee also is seeking information on:-

- the date that hepatitis C was identified as occurring in blood products and whether or not the examination and treatment of blood was carried out timeously once infection was known to occur; and
- the content of your report, and whether or not, it contains background information on hepatitis C, not just in relation to factor VIII, but also in relation to other contaminated blood products.

The Committee is aware that the above may already be covered within your report and if this is the case would not wish you to reiterate the information, however if it is not the case the Committee would be obliged to receive clarification on the above points. The Committee would appreciate an early response to this matter given that you have indicated that your report would be published before the Parliament's summer recess which is due to commence on 7 July 2000.
