Haemophilia and testing without permission

Thank you for your letter of 1" July 2003 and the queries rose therein.

Carol Grayson and some other members of Haemophila Action UK wrote in the summer of 2002 to a number of Deputy Chief Constables all raising the same issues regarding those that had been treated for Haemophilia in the late 1970's and early 1980's. It was decided at the time rather than a number of Police Forces essentially conducting similar inquiries that these inquiries be conducted in a coordinated fashion. I lead for the Association of Chief Police Officers on Personal Crime, and Senior Detectives from my Force met with Carol Grayson and examined a volume of documentation that she presented to them. The Crown Prosecution Services advice was sought regarding the potential of a case being found against the Medical profession and or the Department of Health. The advise of the Crown Prosecution Services was that it would be unlikely following the inquiry to mount a successful prosecution. My Officers personally informed Carol Grayson of this once that advise had been received.
