At endoscopy this gentleman had normal oesophagus. There was a generalised gastritis and he had duodenitis but no focal ulcer was seen. There was spasm of the pylorus.

Duodenitis itself is a rather strange entity and should his symptoms require it, it would be worth treating him with an H2 antagonist for a course. I would not, however, encourage longterm treatment in the absence of proof of a duodenal ulceration as treatment for this latter condition should be continued for life. Should he have a recurrence of symptoms when not on an H2 antagonist he should be re-endoscoped. We will see him once more in this Clinic.
