DIAGNOSES:

Home haemodialysis. Recent parathyroidectomy

This gentleman states that he has started to feel better, for the first few months following the parathyroidectomy he did not feel very well at all. He states that his bone aches have improved and he now has less pruritus. His blood pressure, however, is rather low, often running around 80/60 mmHg when he comes off dialysis. On examination no dependent oedema.

BLOOD PRESSURE:

120/80 mmHg

INVESTIGATIONS:

Potassium 4.1 mmol/L Urea 13.8 mmol/L Creatinine 728 µmol/L Corrected calcium 3.01 mmol/L

Corrected calcium 3.01 mmol/l Phosphate 0.77 mmol/L Haemoglobin 13.3 g/dL

TREATMENT:

Atendol 25 mg four times weekly

1 Alfacalcidol 1 µg daily Calcichew 1,25 gms tds Aspirin 75 mg od

Ferrous Sulphate 200 mg tds

Emla cream 1 drops three times weekly

Mr H s calcium is running rather high. I will ask him to cut his 1 Alfacalcidol to 1 µg daily and his Calcichew to 1.25 gms three times daily. I have also arranged or him to have his calcium rechecked next week. I will also refer him to Dr Gleeson at Royal Hallamshire Hospital regarding his Hepatitis C status.
