The original micronodular cirrhosis was thought to be the cause of previous heavy alcohol consumption. On review in May last year, pt was asymptomatic and liver function tests showed minimal abnormalities with a slightly elevated ALT of 39 and Gamma GT of 78. The remainder of pt's liver function tests were normal.
