**Subject: Allegations Concerning the Treatment of Haemophiliacs**

On Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2002, Detective Chief Inspector Simon Powell and myself met with Mrs Carol Grayson, Mr Peter Longstaff and Mr Colin Potts, being the individuals who initially represented the Haemophiliacs for Action Group, to view the advice document published by Mr Raymond Wildsmith of the CPS Casework Directorate.

In light of the contents of the advice they have accepted that there is no likelihood of a viable criminal prosecution in this matter and are content that the police involvement is ended. I have written to Mr Wildsmith informing him of the outcome of this meeting, copy of the letter is attached.

As this matter was brought to your attention through your ACPO Business Area representation there is a need now to update those Chief Officers where similar allegations had been laid. Mrs Grayson has agreed to inform other members of the group.
