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This lad has been treated with Cryo-precipitate on his recent holidays at home in Wrexham. I understand that he now requires Lister Concentrate. The Haematology Department at Wrexham have had some degree of success in obtaining Lister Concentrate from the Supra-regional Centre at Manchester and Dr. Wensley wrote to me concerning this matter in general. Furthermore I understand you have now been able to send some supplies of Lister Concentrate to Wrexham although apparently the Haematology technician anticipates that this may not be quite enough to see him through all of the summer.

at the Liverpool Royal Infirmary and we do in fact cover the North/Welsh area. If pissible I think it would be helpful if you could let me know the reasons for his transfer to Lister Concentrate and in future we will do our best to supply him with whatever materials are necessary from the Liverpool Haemophiliac Centre. I think the problem has not been brought to my attention before because the Cryo-precipitate which GRO-A has received from the Liverpool Blood Transfusion Service has been adequate therapy.
