Re: GRO-A

Thank you for your letter and report covering the Easter term.

During these holidays I have had an opportunity to discuss the research project using Factor VIII concentrates with GRO-A and his mother and they have agreed to co-operate.

GRO-A's condition has not been very satisfactory this holiday. We have had him up here on three occasions. On the 28th March there was an effusion into the right knee and six units were given. On the 6th April there was an effusion into the right elbow and four units were given, and on the 15th April the right knee was again swollen and six units were given. Physiotherapy has been attempted on the right knee, but in view of the swelling and pain in the knee, this has not been possible more than a few times. The state of his quadriceps is worrying, as it is now very atrophic.

GRO-A has not had an episode like this for some years and it is very much to be hoped that the new preventive treatment will bring his coagulation time under better control.
