MINUTES of the Research Sub-Committee held at Odstock Hospital, Salisbury, Wiltshire on Thursday 8th February, 1973

1/73 Attendance

2/73 Minutes

It was RESOLVED

that the Minutes of the meeting held on 2nd November 1972 be adopted.

3/73 Matters arising from the Minutes

Standard Application Form for Research Grants and Encouragement of Clinical Research

Members were shown the standard application form which would shortly be distributed to Group Secretaries, Chairmen of Group Medical Executive Committees and Clinical Tutors, who would be asked to bring the form to the attention of those wishing to undertake research.

A letter would accompany the application form, giving information about the sources of support available to researchers in the Region. (Mins. 89/72 and 90/72 refer).

4/73 Exchequer Research Allocation for 1973/74

The Committee noted that the Board's allocation for clinical research for 1973/74 was £38,000. Of this, the amount available for new projects was £26,000, the balance of £12,000 being required to meet existing commitments for continuing projects in 1973/74.

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11/73 <u>Clinical trial of a Non-Barbiturate Hypnotic, RO5</u> 6901 (Roche) - Dr. J. Brunning, Consultant Psychiatrist, St. James' Hospital, Portsmouth

> At the request of the Connectee, additional information had been obtained from Dr. Brunning about this proposed trial. The further details submitted by Dr. Brunning had been considered by the Chairman and the Board's Adviser in Clinical Research who had agreed the Board be recommended to raise no objection to this trial being carried out.

> > It was RESOLVED to RECOMMEND

that the action of the Chairman be endorsed.

12/73 Research Equipment

It was RESOLVED to RECOMMEND

- (a) that a register of equipment purchased from the Board's research funds since 1967 be compiled so that apparatus no longer being used for research projects supported by the Board can be made available for allocation to new projects;
- (b) that, with the exception of major items, research equipment purchased from the Board's research funds prior to 1967 be formally handed over to the Hospital Management Committee in whose hospital(s) the original research project took place.

## 13/73 Haemophilia Centre at Alton

The Committee was informed that the first annual report of the work of the Haemophilia Centre at the Lord Mayor Treloar Hospital, Alton, had been produced and copies sent to the Department of Health. Included in the report was a contribution by Dr. R. G. Rainsford, the Research Fellow, and copies of the report were available on request.

14/73 <u>Prophylactic trial in Haemophilia - Dr. P. G. Arblaster.</u> <u>Consultant Physician and Dr. A. Aronstam, Consultant</u> <u>Pathologist, North Hampshire Group.</u>

> The Committee received details of a proposed trial to be carried out at the Lord Mayor Treloar Hospital, Alton, under the direction and control of Drs. Arblaster and Aronstam, to establish whether or not the use of Factor VIII material would reduce the incidence of bleeding in haemophiliacs.

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14/73 Prophylactic trial in Haemophilia - Dr. P. G. Arblaster. Consultant Physician and Dr. A. Aronstam, Consultant Pathologist, North Hampshire Group (continued)

Following discussions with the Chairman, this proposal had been submitted to the Department of Health and Social Security, with the Board's support, and a request made for funds to finance the research over a period of three years.

The Department of Health had now written to say it was willing to make available \$4,000 for the trial, which would be carried out at Alton and a small steering committee was being set up by the Department of Health and the Medical Research Council to advise on the protocol and suggest further revisions to the trial plan where this could be done with advantage. The funding of this project will be arranged by the Department of Health direct with the North Hampshire Group.

The Committee noted this development with satisfaction.
