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I reviewed the above mildly affected haemophilic patient on 3 February 1984. Clinically he was well and his blood counts were satisfactory. He has no evidence of hepatitis on virology studies. He is now under the care of the adult haemophilia unit and I would ask you to stress that he requires dental extractions to be carried out here, also any other surgery.

To keep the records straight, a mild haemophilic of this type should be treated with cryoprecipitate or NHS factor VIII and not commercial freeze-dried factor VIII concentrates. This precaution is to avoid the development of non A non B hepatitis in mildly affected patients.

I am referring him to the adult haemophilia dental clinic under the care of Mr. David Kernohan at the School of Dentistry on this site.
