For his tolerance inducing protocol he is now on alternate day 1005 units Armour Factorate.

Of note is a bout of haematuria on 8.5.83 which lasted for three days.

His latest inhibitor level on the 27th of June was 209 N.O.U.

He will be leaving the college on 15.7.83 for the summer holiday and I have asked him to contact Dr. Strevens for material required during the eight weeks summer holiday.

GRO-A attends physiotherapy for hip stretching exercises. He is walking for short periods now and is doing well. He also started polygym sessions this term and works within his limits.

AIDS RELATED INVESTIGATIONS:

Clinically he exhibits some of the stigmata of AIDS. He has had throat pains and difficulty in swallowing for more than one week in the past and lately at the beginning of June '83 and a cough for more than two weeks on and off. Examination of his superficial lymph nodes on 28.2.83 revealed palpable left axillary and bilateral inguinal lymph nodes. There was no change in the

previous findings when re-examined on 14.6.83.

For your information, we have undertaken the enclosed AIDS related tests. We are repeating these before the end of term and will let you have the results when they are available.
