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

THE NEW HEAT-TREATED FACTOR VIII & IX CONCENTRATES

Thank you for your recent letters about these two new products type 8Y and 9A. At present I cannot see that any patients are suitable for a clinical trial to evaluate their safety as described in the protocols; but I shall bear it in mind when suitable cases present. In the meantime I should like to use both products on the named patient basis, and the names of the patients are listed below:



The excess proportion of Christmas disease patients is because we wish to use your concentrate for them all, whereas some of the haemophilia A patients are treated with cryoprecipitate.

I passed our old untreated factor IX to Dr David Taberner at the Thromboplastin Reference Laboratory at Withington Hospital before your letter came with instructions to return it to you.

The factor VIII concentrate should be supplied through the North Western Blood Transfusion Service. I should be grateful if you would send a supply of factor IX concentrate 9A direct to me.
