Factor IX Supplies

You will remember that I raised with you the question of getting Ministry permission to import more Factor IX concentrate from Professor Soulier, always supposing he has it. We still have Dr. Dormandy's second patient on our waiting list, so I wondered if you had made any progress with this problem?

Plasma for Fractionation

I was rather concerned before Christmas to find that we might temporarily lose our supply of plasma on account of a massive programme to produce cryoprecipitate for a single patient due for major surgery. I think I have been successful in putting my point of view to Dr. Grant, but if there is any further difficulty I will consult you about policy before attempting to get frozen plasma from one of the other regions.

Cryoprecipitate Supernatant

This same massive programme of cryoprecipitate preparation will produce sufficient supernatant to permit the possibility of trying the fractionation on supernatant which has not been re-frozen, as sufficient should be accumulated within one week. I told Dr. Ellis about this before the holiday but I don't know if he and Dr. Preston have been able to arrange anything.
