BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICE: DEVELOPMENTS 1982/83

- 1. I refer to Miss Serrie's letter to you of 1 July on which I would comment as follows against the background of the Minute of the Blood Transfusion Service Sub-Committee of 26 May:-
  - (a) Medicines Inspectorate consequences at the Protein Fractionation Gentre for which £212,000 is available on a <u>non-recurring</u> basis and which in terms of the Sub-Committee's decision should be used for that purpose, or, if appropriate, for other items associated with the Medicines Inspectorate Reports;
    - it would seem from the submission that the purely non-recurring items of £83,290, per paper ref. M.I.E./M.W., can be resolved both from the point of view of finance availability and in regard to the purposes to which the funds are to be applied.
  - (b) Revenue consequences of move of the Edinburgh Centre to new premises for which £160,000 is available on a recurring basis and which in terms of the Sub-Committee's decision are to be used for that purpose, or, if appropriate, for items of a non-recurring nature associated with the Medicines Inspectorate Reports;
    - on the basis that only £106,000 will be needed this year for the move to the new premises, the balance of £54,000 is available in 1982/83 on a non-recurring basis in terms of the Sub-Committee's decision.
  - (c) Funds for the Service as a whole for which £293.800 (£340.000 less the first charges of £46.200 agreed by the Sub-Committee) are available on a recurring basis and which in terms of the Sub-Committee's decision is to be used to the extent necessary for the commissioning of the Micro-Biology Laboratory in the current year and to the extent not so required on a non-recurring basis for the Service as a whole;

on the besis that only £30,000 is to be needed in this year for the micro-biology laboratory, the balance of £263,800 is available on a non-recurring basis in terms of the Sub-Committee's decision from which the undernoted items per paper ref. M.I.S. could be met:-

- 2. From the non-recurring balances at (a) and (b) above of £128,710 and £74,000 respectively, in terms of the Sub-Committee's decision as being available for items associated with Medicines Inspectorate Reports, items in paper ref. M.I.E./M.W. equivalent to these amounts could clearly be met, but would result in a recurring commitment in 1983/84 et seq of £18,271, while the balance, £41,923, of items on paper M.I.E./M.W. could presumably be met this year from the remainder of the funds specified at (c) above but again with a recurring commitment of £4,192 plus £600 for Item 3.7 therein. It should however be noted that no costs are presently available for Item 3.8 of paper M.I.E./M.W.
- 3. Another item, per the paper M.I.S., with a commitment to future years is the data preparation system for the West of Scotland, the amounts being £30,100 in 1982/83 and £28,060 p.a. thereafter; and it should be noted that this Item is one of those approved in principle by the Blood Transfusion Service Sub-Committee on 26 May when it was remitted to the National Medical Director in association with myself to determine its priority as and when finance became available.
- 4. The remaining items included in the National Administrator's memo (per paper M.I.S.) are as shown in Appendix I attached.
- 5. The tabulation at Appendix II, in summarising the terms of this memo, confirms the National Administrator's letter of 1 July in regard to the finance needed to meet the presently assessed needs of the Service as a result of the Medicines Inspectorates Reports; the point at issue being the need to ask the Department now for a commitment in 1983/84 to funding on a recurring basis the shortfall of £184,013. It should be noted in this context that the Service would require to know the outcome of this not later than 15 September.
- 6. On the basis of a fevourable response from the Department the outstanding developments would then bei-
