Section 5. Impact of the Infection
10. Details of my father's condition and the impact of his infections are described in more depth in my mother, GRO-B statement.
11. Our quality of life was horrible at that time. We were only about GRO-B when our father got ill and we could not understand why at that age. I remember GRO-B and I used to sit in Cardiff Hospital and do colouring in books while we waited for our father has his appointments.
12.I remember my father being in a wheelchair for a period of his life. It became harder for him to play with me and my brother GRO-В and I think he preferred to

distance himself from us in order to reduce any risk of transmitting his infection to us.

- 13. We just did not get enough time with him. Even the time we did get was blighted by his infection and its resultant effect on his health. We could not do anything with our father; even going to the park. Although my father could not do all this things we would have liked with us, he did still spoil up, probably to compensate for this. GRO-B and I got handheld Gameboy's for example.
- 14. On our GRO-B which was about 5 months before he died, our father told Professor Bloom that he was leaving the hospital and coming home; something that Professor Bloom said he could not do. Dad refused to listen and was determined to come home regardless. He was sick the whole way home and afterwards, at the end of the day, we took him straight back to hospital as he was in a terrible state. He knew it was GRO-B birthday that he would see and I think that was why he was so determined to come home.
- 15. My father, GRO-B: F died just before Christmas and so GRO-B and I have always hated Christmas. We only do Christmas now for the children.
- 16 GRO-B and I never knew anything other than our father being ill and so we knew nothing different; we did know when he got a lot worse though. I remember more about him from after he died rather than before.
- 17 GRO-B and I were robbed of our childhood and we are still bitter about it to be honest. It was difficult and unfair.
- 18. Life just became like a big lie and it still is really. We could not tell anyone about my father's infection and even now, we have to keep it a secret. People try and dig and ask questions about my father.
- 19. After our father's death it all kicked off in school. GRO-B and I would get picked on after our father died. People would make fun of us for not having a father and we would get into a lot of fights.

20.	The school would put us out of the way in a separate room to calm us down.
	We were so aggressive and wanted to just fight everyone. Everyday we were

24.1 became very withdrawn and distant. I would not come out of my room or
speak to anyone for a few days at a time. Even the last few months, from
around December 2018, every few weeks I would just shut down and was not
interested in anything. It has happened about 5 or 6 times over a 2 month
period. This is when my mother took me to get help and I am on anxiety
medication and take depression tablets. With all the news and Facebook
information I was really overwhelmed.

25 GRO-Band I missed out on a proper education and we did not even real	ly go to
school from about GRO-B We used to rebel against everything a	and just
wanted to fight the system.	

26.From about GRO-B GRO-B and I used to do drugs together until we were about 18/19 year olds. We both still drink quite heavily; I need to drink just to

help me sleep. My mum helped me come off some of the drink but it keeps playing in my mind.

- 27. We used to go out together; we did everything together. We have always worked together; even to this day. GRO-B and I are very close. Once, he tried to commit suicide and my mother phoned me explaining that GRO-B had gone and left a note, she told me to go and find him. I straight away had a feeling that I knew where GRO-B was. I had never been there before and I do not know how I knew, but he was there. We do not even talk to each other about all of this but we know what each other is thinking.
- 28. Only my wife knows about all of this. I have not told my father-in-law who lives with us. I do not tell anyone. I record relevant stuff on the TV and then watch it when everyone has gone to sleep.
- 29. There was a lot of stigma online and it used to really make me angry so I just turned it off and stopped checking it. It became second nature to cover things up. I would turn the news off in case someone would question me as to why I was watching things about contaminated blood. I was and still am paranoid about people finding out.

## Section 6. Treatment/care/support

30. My mother sent me to counselling with GRO-B when we were around GRO-B around 1994 but I never really participated. I was not interested.

## Section 7. Financial Assistance

- 31. I do not know if my father ever received any financial assistance.
- 32. Further details of this are described in my mother, GRO-B statement.

### Section 8. Other Issues

- 33. We are just tired of this whole thing going on; there seems to be no end to it all. I do not even believe the Inquiry will pin this scandal down on anyone as it is just impossible to do.
- 34.1 will never accept what happened but it is time for closure now. That is what we all want.
- 35. Over the years I have just got more and more bitter; especially after doing more research and finding out more information about this.
- 36. When my wife needed a blood transfusion, I was so worried and anxious because of this scandal. I was panicking so much. This is what all this has caused.
