At this time applications for Estates compensation with IBCA are not yet open.

We are working hard to set up the Infected Blood Compensation Authority (IBCA), designing a service that will deliver compensation as quickly and as easily as possible.

We are testing the service with a small group of people initially, these people have already been selected and are already registered with an infected blood support scheme, so are eligible for compensation.

Until IBCA is fully operational, we are unable to record details and comment on individual cases.

We are committed to opening the full compensation service for those who are eligible as soon as we can, although claim and payment timings will depend on a number of things, including how the service performs at each stage, getting the right evidence and support in place and the full regulations being laid in Parliament.

Subject: Submission - Unethical Research

This is a submission regarding Unethical research on my late husband John Wellham Grindley (D.O.B. GRO-C 1952) while at Treloars College, Alton, Hants between 1968-71. (He was Head Boy there in about 1970.) He was a severe haemophiliac who died of A.I.Ds on 13.6. 94 aged 41. His medical records show he was infected with Hepatitis C (Non A, Non B) in 1969 and he was probably infected with Hepatitis B during that time as he had jaundice while attending the College. (I knew him then and remember him just recovering from jaundice.); John was one of the first major intake of haemophiliacs to the College and I believe he was deliberately chosen with others for the purposes of experimentation for medical research. I believe he was not told this (never spoke of it) and that his parents were not aware of it either at the time.

My solicitors Watkins and Gunn in Wales hold my husband's medical records including those from his time at Treloars College and am sure that they can provide evidence to support my submission as required.
