This young man came to my clinic this morning having presented at the weekend with a necrotic bleeding tip of his right middle finger. We stopped the bleeding and cleared up the infection. He was apparently unaware that he was HTLV III antibody positive so I have told him this morning and given him some basic counselling. I wonder if he is correct in this statement.

I also note that he has had intermittent; thrombocytopenia since 1982 and I wonder if you have any more information about that. I have taken a full blood count today to see what his platelet count is like. He still does not have any evidence of AIDS or an AIDS related complex. I am going to see him again to have further counselling sessions.
