Dear GRO-B,

Re: GRO-B

I saw GRO-B in clinic this morning. She is still complaining of a slight trickle of blood down the back of her throat, although by and large she seems much more relaxed now than she was the last time we met. The Epsikapron that she has been taking, is difficult to swallow and I feel that it would be worth swapping her over to Traneximic Acid (Cyelokapron) 500mgs. tds for a trial period of 4 weeks. This is an alternative drug for the stabilization of formed blood clots and if it works it will avoid the necessity of repeated injections of cryo-precipitate with the slight risk of hepatitis or plasma reactions. I have asked her to come and see me again towards the end of the treatment or of course earlier if the bleeding recurs.
