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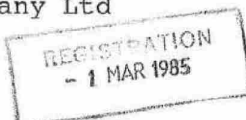

HIGH POTENCY FACTORATE - HEAT TREATED - PL 0231/0044

Thank you for your letter of 25 February 1985 which confirms that information on temperature/time of heat treatment will be included in the data sheet.

However, I am afraid that we cannot accept the proposal that the name should remain unchanged. The Licensing Authority is acting on the advice of the Nomenclature Sub-committee of the British Pharmacopoeia which stipulates that the name of all heat-treated products should have the suffix "Heat Treated" or "H.T.". In consequence this condition applies not only to High Potency Factorate (PL 0231/0044) but also to Factorate (PL 0231/0038).

If you can confirm in writing that you accept this condition the variation of these 2 licences can be approved without delay.
