Further to our recent telephone conversation, I can confirm that the DHSS have insisted that we, as for all other manufacturers/suppliers of such products, include the temperature and time of the heat-treatment in the data sheet (and package insert) text of our products. Additionally, we have had some minor "autocaption" with them over the names of the products in that they require the words 'heat treated' in the product name whereas we wanted these words prominently on the label but with the product name intact. Apparently, and we have been assured by them, that such modification is being made to all other products and other suppliers have apparently agreed.

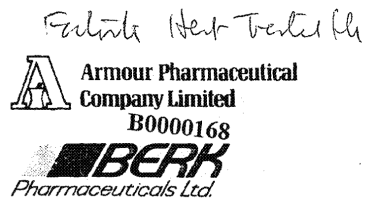
